OSOCA conducts proper monitoring and certification of organic farming in the state and outside the state. OSOCA proposes to provide an institutional mechanism for organic inspection and certification in Pan India to ensure better quality organic products to the consumer. A total of more than 80,000 hectares of farmland has been registered for organic certification so far. OSOCA is committed to provide organic certification to farmers in a transparent manner.

Steps of Organic Certification:

- Request for organic certification by the operator
- Forwarding of necessary formats by OSOCA
- Submission of application for organic certification by the operators.
- Scrutiny of application and approval of organic plan by OSOCA

- Contract between the operator and OSOCA
- Inspection of Organic projects by the Inspectors of OSOCA
- Certification decision by OSOCA
- Issue of certificate and label approval by OSOCA

PGS-India and NPOP Programme

- PGS-India (Participatory Guarantee System of India) is a quality assurance initiative that is locally relevant, emphasizes the participation of stakeholders, including producers and consumers and operates outside the frame of third-party certification.

PGS India system is based on participation, shared vision, transparency and trust.

- PGS India programme provides two types of certificates:

1. PGS-Green Certificate: Granted to those groups which are running under conversion period.

2. PGS-Organic Certificate: Granted to those which have successfully completed the conversion period and have achieved the level of organic.

- The Ministries of Industries and Commerce, Government of India has implemented the National Programme for Organic Production (NPOP) to provide a focused and well-directed development of organic agriculture and quality products. This national programme proposes for the promotion of organic farming and provides an institutional mechanism for the implementation of National Standards for Organic Production.
